This unique 10-week experience in Edinburgh, Scotland, pairs Bumpers College students with faculty and staff at Scotland's Rural College (SRUC). Students perform 10-week paid research internships in their own academic disciplines. Opportunities are available in a variety of disciplines related to agricultural, food, and environmental sciences. Students' hourly wages cover housing costs while in Scotland. This program offers students the opportunity to practice their disciplinary skills and build new ones through experiential learning in a paid internship setting.
